

Among Asian American and Pacific Islander workers, Southeast Asians and Pacific Islanders have the highest prevalence of low-wage work

The bars show the prevalence of low-wage work among Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) groups. For example, 32.7% of Southeast Asian workers are paid a low wage.



In 2022, the value of the low-wage threshold is \$19.69. The sample includes workers who live and work in California, were employed last week but not self-employed, ages 16+, and with non-zero earnings last week. See "Data and Methods" for the definition of each AAPI group.
