## Almost 9 out of 10 low-wage workers are employed in the private sector

Bars show the share of workers who are paid low wages in the private or public sector, relative to the share of all workers in each sector. For example, 88.4% of workers who are paid low wages are

employed in the private sector while 83.6% of all workers in the labor force are employed in the private sector. Private sector Low-wage workers 88.4%

In 2022, the value of the low-wage threshold is \$19.69. The sample includes workers who live and work in California, were employed last week but not self-employed, ages 16+, and with non-zero earnings last week. To calculate the share

of workers paid low wages in 2021, we inflate 2021 wages to 2022 dollars and apply the 2022 low-wage threshold. The public sector includes federal, state, and local government employees.
